

## Taking A Walk On The Wild Side

Dr Jeremy Sternson has recruited friends, friends of friends, colleagues and anyone who couldn't say no to his very persuasive and enthusiastic pitch to join him on the hike of their life – 230kms, 8850m ascent, 8840m descent to raise awareness and much needed funds to support our aim of improving the oral health of Australians. They will start the trek on 27 October.

Dr Sternson is a general dentist in private practice. He is the Chair of the eviDent Foundation, Deputy Co-Vice Chair of the Dental Practice Based Research Committee; an eviDent Associate Investigator; an ADAVB Councillor, a member of the ADAVB Sports and Social Committee, a husband, a father of three, a farmer, a keen fly-fisherman and apparently does not need sleep (how else could he do all of that?!). His passion for excellence in dental treatment and care has made a profound difference for his patients.

Jeremy's support for oral health care does not end in his practice. His 'hands-on' approach is what makes this challenge possible!

The Australian Alpine Walking Track winds 655kms from Walhalla in Victoria to Tharwa in NSW. The eviDent Foundation's 2016 inaugural **Alpine Walking Track Challenge** will encompass one third of the trail, through one of the most pristine alpine environments in Australia. It is considered one of the best walks in the world! The walk is so challenging that few people have ever done the whole track.

Imagine walking from Mt Hotham to Mt Kosciuszko. It's like climbing Everest from sea level and descending again!

Jeremy works every day to improve the lives of his patients. As an Associate Investigator of the eviDent Foundation, he is actively involved in optimising health outcomes you really can't have without research.

Did you know oral cancer is the 8th and 13th most common cancer for males and females respectively?

It is difficult to detect, remaining undiagnosed until well advanced. Prognosis is often poor, with devastating effects to those who

are unfortunate to acquire it, from facial disfigurement to death. The eviDent Foundation is currently testing the ability of an Oral Cancer Risk Test to improve early detection rates and identify patients at risk of developing this deadly disease. 
Each hiker is paying their own way so all proceeds will go to the eviDent Foundation.
